

Remember to Lock Your Vehicles, Even When Parked at Home

As the weather warms, the Olympia Fields Police Department would like to remind all residents to keep their vehicles locked. Avoid being the victim of a car burglary by making it a habit to lock your doors each and every time you leave your vehicle, even when you're at home. Most vehicle burglaries happen in residential areas.

Remove valuables such as electronics, credit/debit cards, wallets, GPS units and cellular phones. If you cannot remove valuable items, keep them out of plain view. Use areas of the vehicle not as commonly burglarized, such as the trunk, to store your items. Do not hide items in the glovebox or center console and always close your windows and sun roofs.

5 reasons not to top trees

1. Topping is expensive
2. Topped trees become hazardous and unsightly
3. Topping can remove leaves that protect the branches and trunk from sun overexposure
4. Topping causes decay
5. Topping stresses trees, which can lead to insect and disease infestations

When Trees Get Too Tall

Sometimes a tree must be reduced in height or spread, for example, to provide clearance for utility lines. You may be tempted to "top" trees yourself, but topping is not a viable method of height reduction and can actually make a tree more hazardous in the long term.

Topping is the practice of cutting tree branches to stubs or lateral branches that are not large enough to assume the terminal role. Topping is also known as "heading," "tipping," "hat-racking," and "rounding over".

Please be sure to contact a licensed arborist for assistance with reducing tree height or spread in a way that preserves the health of the tree

Respond to the 2020 Census

Your responses to the 2020 Census are vital to insure government representation,

resources and funding for our community! Include everyone who resided in your home as of April 1, 2020 in your response.

To raise visibility, the Community Relations Commission ordered signs and worked with the HOAs to place them throughout the village. As a result of this joint effort and the residents' strong response, we are pleased to report that, based on data provided by the Census Bureau Partnership Liaison, the response rate increased from 63% to 69% after one week of signage!

Note: You still have time to respond! Responses are due by October 31, 2020, with door to door canvassing scheduled from August 11 through October 31, 2020. Paper questionnaires were mailed on May 9, 2020 to those households which have not previously responded.

Let's keep up the good work with an aim to crush the 2010 final response rate of 75%.
