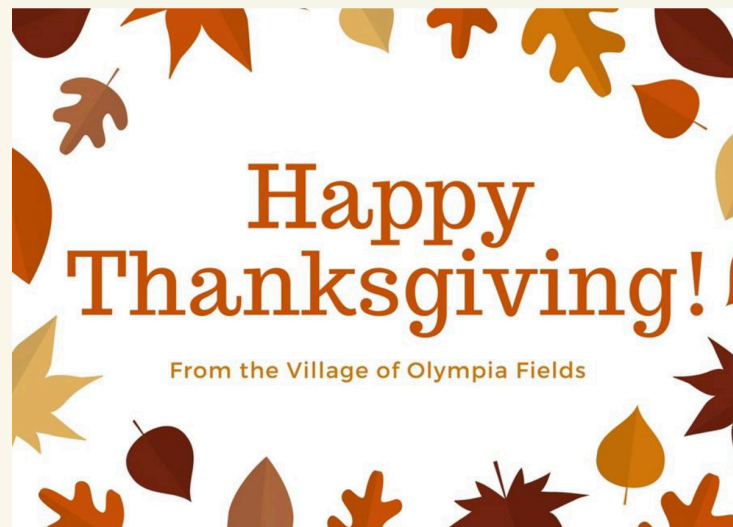
Volunteer at Rich Central High School's INCubatorEdu Program To Mentor Students Through An Entrepreneurship Experience

The Annual Road and Drainage Project in the Arcadia Subdivision, Greenwood Drive and Olympia Fields East Subdivision is Nearly Complete

The annual road and drainage project started during the first week of November in the Arcadia subdivision, Greenwood Drive and Olympia Fields East subdivision on 207th Street. All drainage work for the project has been completed and landscaped.

The schedule for the remainder of the project is as follows:

- Road prep: Monday, November 29
- Road surface grinding: Tuesday, November 30 to Thursday, December 2
- Asphalt paving: Friday, December 3 to Monday, December 6
- Pavement markings: Tuesday, December 7 to Thursday, December 9
- The entire project complete: Friday, December 10

All of these schedules are tentative and could change due to weather.
